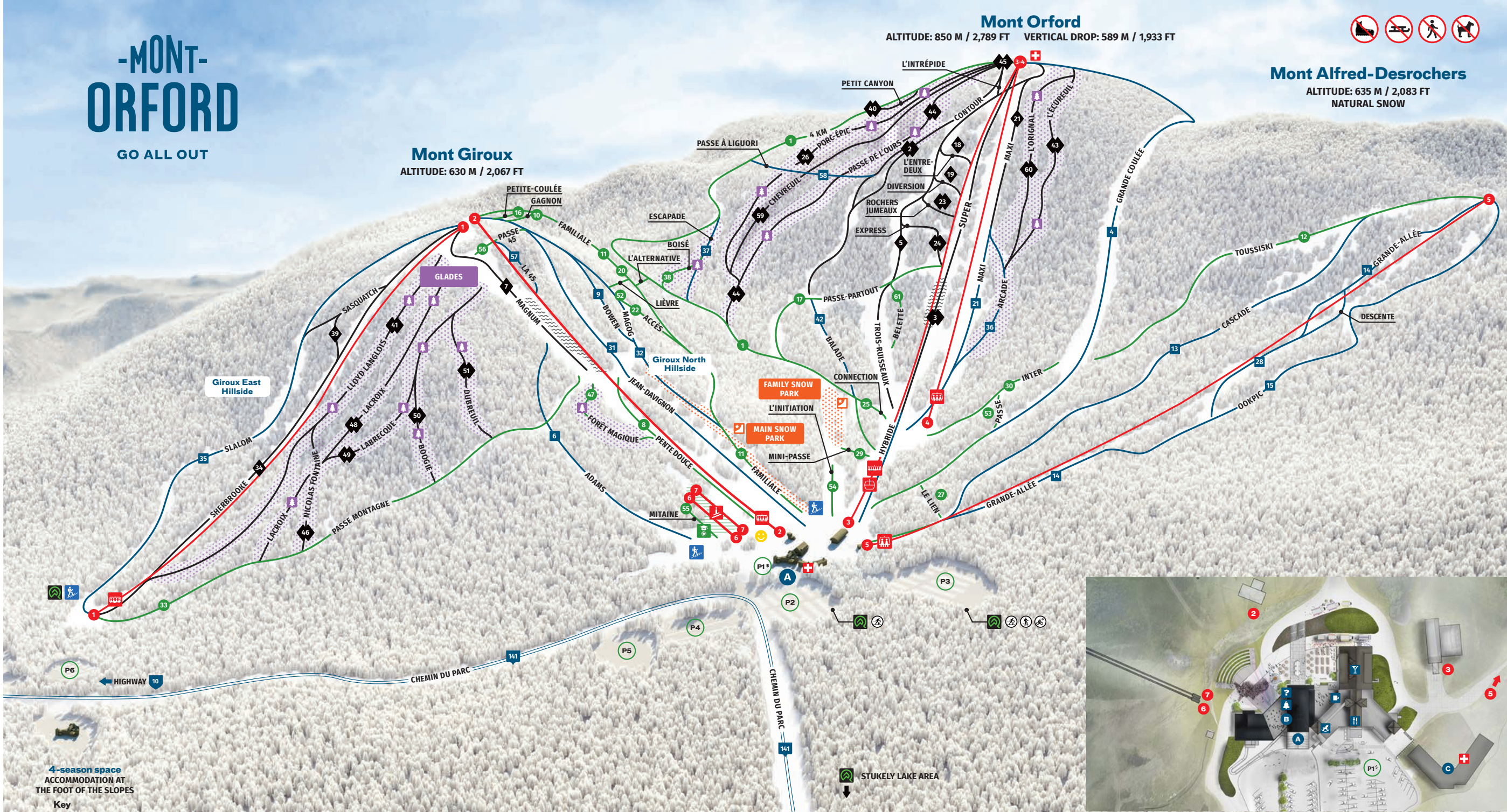

SNOW PARKS



MAIN PARK

Level: Intermediate to expert. Perfect for all freestylers! The Main park with its two lines of modules (an intermediate series and an advanced series) as well as a series of consecutive jumps is known for the quality of its facilities and the diversity of its modules.

FAMILY

Designed specifically to help all skiers develop and advance their skills on small modules, it is a secure setting where the entire family can find a challenge and have fun learning about the joys of freestyleing.

INTRO

A playground located near the foot of the slopes and filled with small-sized modules and boxes designed specifically to introduce skiers to modules. Available only when conditions allow it.

Helmets are mandatory on all snow parks. Free access with your daily ticket or season pass.

LEARNING AREAS



The learning areas were designed on low grade areas with inclined turns and magic carpet lifts for skiers and snowboarders who are still at a preliminary learning stage. These areas are identified by a green symbol on the map.

UPHILL SKIING



Mont-Orford allows the practice of uphill skiing in designated areas throughout the regular ski season, when conditions permit. Purchase a daily ticket or season pass specific to uphill skiing online, or at customer service, to access the ascent zones.

Cleats and snow shoes are prohibited on the uphill ascent routes and trails. A map detailing the uphill skiing trails is also available at Customer Service or online.

- No dogs allowed.

CODE OF CONDUCT

CODE ADOPTED UNDER THE SPORTS SAFETY ACT. THIS CODE APPLIES TO ANYONE PRACTICING A SNOW SPORT.

- Stay in control of your speed and direction. Be prepared to stop on short notice or avoid obstacles and other participants.
- Yield the right of way to people downhill and take a direction that ensures their safety.
- Only stop on a trail if you are visible from the top and if you are not obstructing the trail.
- Yield the right of way to those uphill when you enter a trail and at intersections.
- If you are involved in or have witnessed an accident, remain at the scene and identify yourself to the first-aid respondents.
- Always have a proper device on-hand to avoid runaway equipment.
- Keep off the trails or lifts if you are under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- Obey all signs and warnings and never venture off the trails or onto a closed trail.

Snow sports are dangerous. Please always exercise caution and use common sense to reduce risk.

For a safe and rewarding experience, follow the Mountain Code of Conduct and remain courteous to others at all times. You must comply with any other rules and signs posted or otherwise indicated by the Mont-Orford Ski Station.

It's your responsibility to always be vigilant and respect the code of conduct.
